## THE NEEDS OF LIVING THINGS


A living thing's habitat, the place where it lives, needs to include all of the things necessary for it to survive. Some living things can get everything they need in a very small space, but some need a much larger area to live. Not only do sizes of habitats vary, but they also exist within one another. For example, a wolf's habitat may be a forest, but within that forest there could be a pond that is the habitat of a frog. Within that swamp there could be a rotting log that would be the habitat to many insects. Regardless of the size or location, the habitat must provide all the necessities of life.
